# “COMPLETUS”

six settings from Compline

Kerry Milan

"COMPLETUS" is a setting of texts taken from or associated with the service of Compline, the last of the eight services comprising the Divine Office. It contains some of its most beautiful prayers; but apart from Simeon's great song of praise most have rarely if ever been set to music, perhaps because Compline was most commonly a said service, except for high days and holidays.

Basil the Great (d. 379) mentioned a form of Compline, referring especially to the singing of Psalm 91 (XC in the Vulgate numbering) *Qui Habitat*, which is still said today, together with other psalms with a special relevance to night, or to sleep as the image of Death. *Qui Habitat* has itself been set comparatively rarely, most notably, twice, by Josquin des Prez (d. 1521), with a four part motet setting and a large a capella 24 voice canon.

The final prayer was usually followed by an antiphon, often called a 'votive' antiphon, and more specifically a 'Marian' antiphon; but from the late 1520s there was a discernable trend towards the composition of so-called 'Jesus' antiphons, and John Taverner's *O Splendor Glorie* is a fine five-part example of this latter category.

Twenty years later in 1548 a Royal Injunction for Lincoln Cathedral decreed "They shall from henceforth sing or say no anthems of our Lady or other saints, but only of our Lord, and them not in Latin".

The text for *O Radiant Light* is an English translation of the Latin used by John Taverner for *O Splendor Glorie*. His opening four-bar phrase also begins this new eight part setting, which is the sixth and final movement of Kerry Milan's COMPLETUS which opens with *Qui Habitat*, again for double choir.

The third movement, a setting of *Keep me as the apple of an eye* with *Lighten our darkness*, is also in eight parts, and in addition there are also optional parts for trombone quartet (ATTB) for this movement only (available on request).

The other three movements are for SATB, with divisions, the arrangement for which will vary according to the circumstances.

Note that in some of the early sections of *Qui Habitat* the two groups, whether or not decani and cantoris, sing in different metres. As the metre switches between simple and compound time the tempo adjusts slightly (but not such that the beat or quaver remains the same). The suggested tempo markings give an indication of what is intended and in general tempi are given simply to indicate a suggested relationship between different parts of a movement. The duration of the whole piece is approximately 32 minutes.
