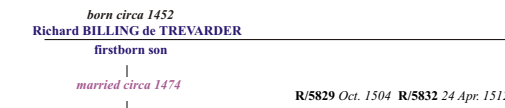


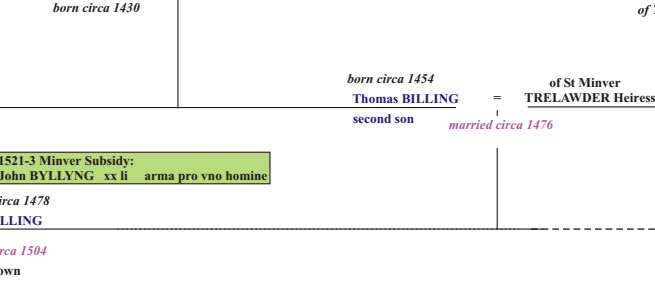
BILLING OUTLINE

This outline sets out the BILLING alias TRELAWDER family connections in Cornwall over two hundred years. It is unusual to see an alias - our modern equivalent being the hyphenated name - being sustained over so long a time.



THE HERALD'S VISITATION OF 1620 FOCUSED SOLELY ON THE LINE OF JOHN BILLING / TRELAWDER'S FIRST SON JOHN WHO MARRIED MARGERY BLEWET AND SETTLED AT ST TUDY IN THE 1640S.

BILLING update, December 2018. The rest of the family successfully finished their 1000 piece jigsaw puzzle; but sadly we have not been so successful in joining together the many hundreds of pieces that make up the BILLING alias TRELAWDER story.

As mentioned earlier, the 1874 book on the Cornwall Visitations by the Harleian Society, of which Vivian was one of the editors, only followed the main Billing line.

Someone with the time and expertise to study and understand all the National Archives documents (some held at Cornwall Archives) please come forward!

National Archives document R/8332 has a supposed date of 24 April 1512; but is endorsed with a note by C. G. Henderson "This deed was forged about 17 Eliz. [1577] by Nicholas Beauchamp of Chilton (denounced by the Devon Jury)"

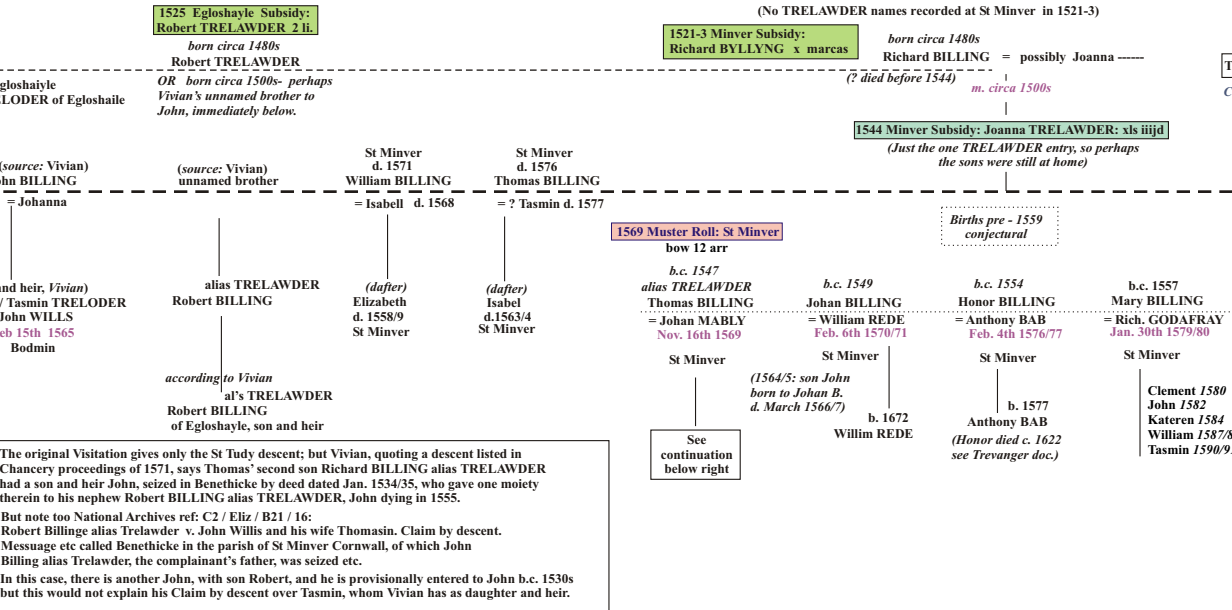
But R/8338, which claims that John BILLING benefitted fraudulently from deeds 'not made in truth but only for perturbation of Wm. Billing alias Trelawder' is dated 12 January 1576, and if this date is correct then clearly the forgeries were NOT done in 1577; pace the previous references.

If nothing else, this shows the difficulty in dating documents 450 years old. And of more immediate concern, the William listed below died in 1571 and we don't have another William, so hopefully he is the one subject to the 'perturbation'.

The original Visitation gives only the St Tudy descent; but Vivian, quoting a descent listed in Chancery proceedings of 1571, says Thomas' second son Richard BILLING alias TRELAWDER had a son and heir John, seized in Beneficence by deed dated Jan. 1534/35, who gave one moiety therein to his nephew Robert BILLING alias TRELAWDER, John dying in 1555.

But note too National Archives ref: C2 / Eliz / B21 / 16: Robert Billing alias Trelawder v. John Willis and his wife Thomas. Claim by descent. Message etc called Beneficence in the parish of St Minver Cornwall, of which John Billing alias Trelawder, the complainant's father, was seized etc.

In this case, there is another John, with son Robert, and he is provisionally entered to John b.c. 1536 but this would not explain his Claim by descent over Tasmyn, whom Vivian has as daughter and heir.

Strangely, there are no baptism records for these three births - but in 1571 the St Minver records are almost non-existent - just one! Rosie and Pentecost are placed here provisionally. John's marriage records him as son of Thomas.

BRAR83363 - 1678, reference to Richard BILLING the younger's garden

BRAR83360 - Jan. 1st 1692/92, re Ralph Billing alias Trelawder, mariner, of Endellion, lives of Richard Billing the elder, Richard Billing the younger and the lessee [Ralph] of a message and garden in Port Isaac occupied by Richard Billing, father of Ralph Billing.

BRAR83359 - 1677, re Richard BILLING alias TRELAWDER the younger, mariner, Port Isaac, his wife Mary and son Richard.

BRAR83361 - 1706, re Richard BILLING mariner of Port Isaac and Elizabeth his wife and Richard his son.

The Quaker Sarah RUNDELL's grandmother was a CONSTABLE. An earlier John CONSTABLE had married Dorothy HOCKEN, whose sister Ann married Reginald BILLING, Loveday HAMBLY's uncle.

Samuel BILLING [1748]: Gent. Formerly Master of vessel and kept Dolphin Inn. First of family at Port Isaac a Quaker. Charity MITCHELL [1756]: Widow of John Mitchell. She is grand-daughter to Mr. Billing, the Quaker, a very respectable merchant formerly of this place.
